You will have heard that the government is currently reviewing the Vetting and Barring proposals. Though some modifications are anticipated, the expectation is that the scheme will be going ahead. The Independent Safeguarding Authority is in place, and is already carrying out many of its new duties. The conference on 1 September will be giving up to date developments in regard to Vetting and Barring and explaining the role of the ISA.

The CCPAS disclosure staff will also be present on the day to meet CCPAS 'recruiters' - sometimes known as 'verifiers' i.e. those who process CRB forms in churches and organisations. There will be a session on the new forms and other anticipated developments in relation to the CRB process.

The conference will also be exploring other aspects relating to safe recruitment and will provide an opportunity for reviewing our new 'Safe and Secure' DVD.

We have chosen Central London as the venue for this unique event in order to make it as accessible to as many people as possible. Why not plan to send a representative(s) from your church or organisation? There is a good range of accommodation locally if distance means an overnight stay.
